Readings for Marriage Ceremonies

This list of popular non-religious wedding ceremony readings as well as common bible readings will help you to choose one or more that you might want to include in your ceremony.

But first, why would you want to have any readings during your ceremony?

Readings can serve a number of purposes. They can be used to include a family member or friend in the ceremony. A humourous reading at the beginning can set the tone for the ceremony and the rest of the celebration.

Readings are also used to have a ceremony length that has your guests satisfied that it was neither too long or too short.

If the family on one side is very religious, a bible reading will help include faith into the ceremony.

Who can do the readings?

Anyone can, children to grandparents or friends can play a part in the ceremony by doing a reading. Religious readings cannot be performed by the marriage commissioner and must be read by a family member or guest as the marriage commissioner cannot be seen to have a particular religious affiliation.
